<u>Congregational Budget Meeting Minutes</u> November 21, 2021

Present: 72 members

Shavon Erb called the meeting to order at 11:43 AM and opened with prayer. Josh, the Council Treasurer, came up to the stage to discuss the budget. He discussed how the budget is created through collaboration with ministry leaders, staff, Don Davern, the Finance Committee, and Council. He highlighted that our income is down this year, so staff salaries were not increased for the second year in the row and the benevolence items were cut in half from 10% down to 5%. He then opened the floor for discussion and questions.

There were a few questions:

- A question was asked if staff salaries are included in the Kids or STudent ministry line item on the budget. It was confirmed that staff salaries were not included in this.
- This line is specifically just expenses from the ministries (most of this is covered by students attending the trips and families covering expenses). The church will do scholarships for students as needed, but a majority of the expenses are covered by families and students attending those events/trips.
- 43% of the 10% of benevolence funds goes to the NE Synod. Roughly, \$20-25K.
- Property and maintenance items have actually increased even though we have one property instead of two. The line item on the budget is just for property and maintenance. It doesn't include the capital items and most of this wasn't budgeted initially as we were not sure what the cost would be.
- Congregational contributions include historical data to estimate and we also include pledge numbers to help estimate, but this number always changes when the actual gifts come in.
- Travel expenses for staff to attend retreats and professional developments are analyzed to allow for judgement to be considered as to the most cost effective way to attend these items (ie., attending virtually instead of traveling to the conference). Staff use discretion to determine where items can be cut.
- Other income consists of over abundance on student trips and ministry, Little Lights fees being collected, and other items that come in throughout the year.
- Evangelism is down by \$20K. This cut was due to a cut on staff to eliminate a Social Media Coordinator role that we will not have this year.
- The deficit at the bottom was discussed as the fact that we have an income issue, we have cut expenses faithfully. We need to spread the word about income and giving and how this increase can help us with our expense issues.
- To help with trying to get our income we have been diligent and sent letters and pushed hard in the last couple weeks to try and help increase our income.
- The use of passing the plate and the use of the boxes in the back of the room was used during Covid and as a church we are now going back to the passing of the plates as of today and going forward. We are hopeful this will serve a reminder and help to increase the giving as well.

Vote was held and the budget was unanimously approved.

Council and the Finance Committee will monitor the budget over the few months and will pray that giving increases to meet the projected deficit. If income does not increase, we will have a congregational meeting in March or April of 2022 to vote and discuss where cuts will need to be made.

Meeting adjourned at 12:02 PM with a prayer.

Lead Pastor's Report See, I am doing a new thing. ~Isaiah 43:19

Predominant in our hearts during 2021 was the joy of God doing new things after the darkness and difficulties of 2020. As we emerged from the restrictions of 2020, Trinity experienced God-guided newness to reorient our future.

First, we moved into a new location. After two decades of planning and preparation, we were able to process with the cross from the Family Life Center into our new mission center. Since our first service on January 31st, we have been singing praises, praying, learning from the Word, receiving the sacraments, and growing together as the people of God. Volunteers and staff have worked diligently to learn effective use of our new technology. Leaders have worked to evolve our Worship Center service into a natural expression of our traditional Lutheran confessions and values. Although this proved to be a challenging process, we have kept God's mission at the forefront, developing a meaningful service, faithful to our tradition while reaching those who have just encountered the Christian faith. If you have not been to worship recently, I encourage you to give it a try! A significant affirmation of our worship effectiveness can be noted in the four adults who were baptized at Trinity in 2021. We are connecting people to Christ.

Second, we have experienced new giving. In May we embarked on a three-year initiative titled GO in which \$1,200,000 was raised for two purposes. The first is mission. Leadership is working on a local mission focus, equipping our building with final furnishings, and providing resources for community events to create natural opportunities to engage with Christ. The second purpose of GO will pay our monthly mortgage for the next three years. Additionally, last fall we brought to your attention our \$100,000 shortfall in the General Fund. The congregation provided \$63,000 in additional funds which has allowed us to end 2021 with a \$37,000 shortfall. We know that our generosity is an expression of our faith, and our giving shows that we are growing in Christ. It is important to continue to respond generously so that we can continue our mission without the need to reduce staff or ministry programming.

The greatest transition that I see is our new emphasis on mission, specifically Connecting People to Christ. The Church is here to reach people who do not yet have a relationship with Jesus Christ and to mentor them into becoming fully devoted followers of Jesus. Our building was designed for this purpose. Our worship has evolved for this purpose. Our staff and Council leadership focus on this mission to make the very best decisions. And this church family is living this mission. I hear your stories and rejoice because of your love and care for your "ones". This newness influences every part of Trinity Church.

I want to thank our staff, council and leadership for their partnership in the Gospel. We have walked through unique challenges, unimaginable opportunities, great difficulties, and remained faithful to the Gospel. Thank you.

Finally, I want to thank the congregation for remaining faithful. We have partnered together for the mission to which we have been called by God. In the coming year, may we feel even more released to engage in mission, worship with enthusiasm, and give generously.

Connecting Kids and Families to Christ

Trinity Kids is thriving in our new building! We love our new space, new furnishings, and new families (11) who have joined us on our adventures to learn more about Jesus! Covid made Kids' ministry more challenging, but we continue to share God's love with those He brings to us, averaging around 40 each week.



Our Trinity Kids volunteers are amazing! Between decorators, setup, check-in, nursery and helpers, we have over 50 dedicated volunteers (18 of which are new in 2021) who all contribute to connecting kids to Christ throughout the year. Kids' faces light up when they are greeted by these trusted adults and students who are creating community with our kids! Those once reluctant to come now rush in to see their friends and teachers!



Outside of Sunday mornings, **Trinity Kids hosted four incredible events:** Treasured VBS in June, and three family events including Bake-off in March (17 families), Trunk or Treat in October (22 trunks/over 150 people) and Gingerbread Christmas in December (20 families/100 people)! Treasured VBS occupied nearly every inch of our building and grounds with 130 kids from Trinity, Little Lights, and the community! Over 85 volunteers ensured maximum fun for all involved! Each day through crafts, skits, Bible stories and game, kids discovered they are priceless to God!



Service to others is a huge part of Trinity Kids! Weekly and VBS offerings support Mary Kamara at the Roots Home in Sierra Leone, Africa. In addition, Heartland Hope Mission in South Omaha benefitted from the 394 boxes of macaroni and cheese VBS kids brought as well as the x jars of peanut butter from Jingle Jars for Jesus! Our Trinity Kids are a blessing to others!



2021 marks the nearly full second year of the alternate status quo the entire world was thrown into at the start of 2020. Last year also marked nearly the first full year in the new building. These realities have meant that Trinity Students has had to completely reformat how ministry is done.

At the beginning of 2021, Trinity Students was still only online using Zoom. We called it, Trinity Students Live. This served its purpose, however, students quickly got zoom fatigue as they also used this platform for school every day. We reformatted again.

After briefly being able to meet outdoors for summer Bible study, requirements shut us down again. Rather than trying to fit a the square shape we had become into a the circle hole we had been, we reinvented our online format once again. Centering around Social Media, regularly posting online messages, weekly engagement questions, fun activities such as video game nights, and quizzes/polls, our engagement increased and helped overcome the zoom fatigue.

We resumed in-person ministry in late spring in our new student-designated space, a first in my tenure at Trinity Church. The return brought much excitement! With a completely new social culture, we reformatted once again. Our volunteers are trained differently, the weekly in-person ministry is done differently, and we have had to adopt our ministry to fit our new space. Similar to pruning a garden, I believe these changes have created a healthier version of Trinity Students.

It has been fulfilling to see our students excited about church and Trinity Students after a period of being physically separated. They are excellent inviters. As I reflect on our recent New Years Party an example of this comes to mind. There were six first time guests were present. It's rare that we go more than a week without having at least three or four new guests. For many of these guests, it's their first time connecting with a church. Our students do a great job helping their friends experience a loving and caring community, and our adult leaders get to be a source of encouragement for their spiritual growth. Every time a student guest transitions from a guest to a core Trinity Student member, I am reminded of Trinity's mission of connecting people to Christ.

Although our students didn't get to experience Mission Trip (high school) or Adventure Trip (middle school) in 2021, we hosted our own student conference, RESET 2021. It was a beautiful convergence of three churches along with Campus Life that included service projects, worship, and messages. This event was a marker moment for a handful of our students as they went from being "Trinity Students guests" to "Core Trinity Students Members". We brought in an out of city band and flew in three speakers, including a former Dare 2 Share speaker who has spoken internationally. He sent me a text that RESET was one of the most impactful and well-organized small conferences he's had the privilege of speaking at.

As we enter 2022, Trinity Students continues to faithfully reflect upon how to best connect our Students to Christ. We have a vision team that meets weekly to pray for all the students in Trinity, as well as the students in our community. We look towards 2022 invigorated at the prospect of what God will do at Trinity.

Connection Groups and Associate Pastor's Report

2021 was a year of fruitful, enjoyable, and varied ministry for me as Associate Pastor at Trinity. Some of my ministry foci remained the same as previous years. I continue serving in worship (preaching, hosting, and administering the sacraments) and officiating at weddings and funerals. While hospital and care center visiting came to a screeching halt in 2020, we were once again able to resume those visits in 2021.

2021 also brought many new experiences. I defended my doctoral dissertation "Unplugging to Connect: Reimagining Christian Identity Formation in the Digital Age" in January and graduated in May with a Doctor of Ministry degree from Western Theological Seminary in Holland, MI. My D.Min. research explored how the constant connection so many of us live with affects our emotional, mental, and spiritual health. My project invited families from Trinity to practice imaginative prayer for six weeks; parents debriefed about their experience with the prayers. I'm grateful for the involvement and support of Trinity throughout this program.

In September I took on some additional responsibilities in adult discipleship, guest follow up, and new member assimilation. My goal in this area is for each adult in Trinity to be challenged and supported to grow as a follower of Jesus. Trinity's main vehicle for adult discipleship is Connection Groups. At the end of 2021, we had fifteen connection groups that meet regularly for Bible study, community building, and prayer support/encouragement. Those groups have a total listed membership of 187 participants. In addition, we have groups that meet to serve within and outside of the church or to gather around an activity of shared interest. Connection Groups faced some challenges this year. While some returned to pre-Covid meeting schedules and patterns, others are still working on connecting again. I'd love to have every Trinity adult involved in a Group. We have a solid base, but we definitely have much more work to do.

In 2021, sixty-five adults met for eight Sunday nights for the Emotionally Healthy Relationships course. This group showed up faithfully, shared stories of their relational habits, and diligently worked on developing new patterns of relating to others. Also, a new men's group for life-on-life discipleship started in mid-November. This group met weekly to read through a section of Mark's Gospel, to share about an important, relevant topic from their lives, and to support each other in prayer. Recently we expanded into two groups with exponential possibilities for further growth.

One more thing - I'm currently working with our discipleship initiative team to explore discipleship pathways for new and existing members of Trinity. Our goal is for each adult participant in Trinity's ministry to identify and work toward a next step in his or her life as a follower of Jesus. Stay tuned for more information about the work of this team.

I believe that God calls each Christian to lifelong growth. If you're looking to grow as a follower of Jesus, I'd love to meet with you. Here are some growth options we could explore. You should consider signing up for the upcoming Emotionally Healthy Spirituality course that will meet on Sunday nights from February 20-April 10. I'd love to get you plugged into a Connection Group. We could talk about how you might grow through enneagram coaching. You might want to know more about a men's discipleship group. And I'd love to hear your story of life with Jesus and dream with you about your next steps in living abundant life with him.

Missions and Pastoral Intern's Report

Over the last two years it has been difficult to know how we should effectively serve and work with the mission organizations with whom we have partnered and for which we care deeply. I am excited to share just a bit about our ministry partners here at Trinity and am also so thankful for the work they do sharing the love of Christ out into the world.

The Raining Season is our mission partner in Sierra Leone, West Africa. They have been thriving in so many ways while also sharing with me their desire to see mission teams come and join them again in the work they do in person. We are hoping to be able to take a team over sometime in the next year assuming travel is back up and running.

The orphanage continues to care for nearly 100 kids of various ages. This orphan home in particular has a significant impact in caring for children with special needs. There is much work going on behind the scenes that I am unable to share at this time, but rest assured God is moving in some really incredible ways in Sierra Leone. There are also now two Roots Houses (transitional housing for older kids) that allow the older kids at the orphanage to begin to figuring out how to live and function as adults in Sierra Leone.

Our mission partner in India, Shalom Ministries, has experienced a lot more impact in the population of India than TRS has experienced in Sierra Leone. Shalom continues to train and equip native missionaries. They also spend a good amount of time caring for widows and the outcasts of their society.

Locally our church continues to serve and support Heartland Hope, Stephen Center, Empty Tomb, and Youth For Christ. We have partnered with Campus Life (Youth For Christ) in the hiring of Jordan Kinstler who serves in Trinity Students while also working for Campus Life reaching students in the Papillion and LaVista Schools.

Little Miracles is a newer Trinity Church ministry which started in June of 2020. Its purpose is to help mothers in need during their child's first year of life. We provide self-care items for the mother and items they need for their baby. Moms submit a request online and we hold a monthly pick-up time for them to receive their items. Since its beginning, Little Miracles has helped 15 mothers, given away over 1,500 diapers, 5 high chairs, 3 cribs, and utilized the help of 10+ volunteers, countless donors. We have a Little Miracles Facebook community. This is a space for anyone interested in partnering with Little Miracles and the opportunity to connect moms and their families to Christ. You will find this group at <u>www.facebook.com/groups/littlemiracles.tc/</u>.

On September 1st my role changed from Pastor In Training to Pastoral Intern which has meant a few changes in my role. Since then I have had the opportunity to work with Pastor Ellen from St Thomas Lutheran Church as my off-site Supervisor. She has helped me get a different perspective and see experiences in ministry in new ways. Internship year involves being more involved in conversations like stewardship and leadership. I am lucky to have a congregation to serve that values training and equipping leaders in the church. I look forward to continuing to serve Trinity while learning and growing in pastoral leadership.

I am also excited for what God has done this past year and look forward to how He will call Trinity Church in the next year, sending us to serve, love, and share the Good News of Jesus in 2022.

Worship Minister's Report

As I entered into my second year of serving as your worship minister, I could not have imagined the challenges that we as a church and myself as a leader would have to endure and work through. Simultaneously, I could not have imagined the victories and growth in faith and character we would experience. The New Testament writer James captures a unique truth when he says that "the testing of your faith develops perseverance." That was proven in 2021.

First and perhaps most obviously, we moved into a new building. Our worship center equipped with some amazing technology, has allowed us to expand our ministry and liturgical imagination. Using intelligent lighting, we have been able to enhance the visual palette of worship, capturing emotion and expression as well as the different seasons of the church calendar. With a new sound system and acoustic friendly room, we have greatly increased our potential for excellence in the quality of sound. Last but certainly not least, we have been able to livestream as a means of helping our congregation remain engaged during the uncertainties of the Covid-19 pandemic.

These wonderful areas of technological expansion and growth serve as tools to facilitate opportunities and cultivate rhythms for people to experience our mission and vision. We've seen a number of people, from long-term members of Trinity to spiritual seekers in our community, become engaged with our congregation and take massive strides in growing their relationship with and maturity in Christ. Worship is essential to this process for several reasons.

- 1. It gives us language to process our faith both as individuals and as a faith community. As we sing songs, say the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer, celebrate and receive the sacraments, and hear from the Scriptures, we open ourselves to the Holy Spirit's work of transforming how we live our lives.
- 2. It connects us to a two-thousand-year-old faith tradition. Our faith is not lived in isolation or in a vacuum, detached from history and relationships. Worshiping together is a chance to reconnect with our collective faith history and recognize that in following Jesus, we are a part of something so much bigger than ourselves: God's kingdom coming to earth.
- 3. It creates space for people to move from intellectual knowledge of God to personal experience of His presence. As we encounter God in our own hearts and minds, both personally and communally, we grow to know and love him more deeply. This in turn translates into loving our neighbors as we love ourselves, providing them with the opportunity to experience God's presence through their relationship with us.

Finally, I want to take a moment to highlight our worship ministry volunteers. There are many who serve on a weekly basis, both visibly and invisibly, without whom worship would simply not happen. These volunteers are instrumentalists, vocalists, slide runners, camera people, and sound board operators. Without them, so much of our Sunday ministry would simply not happen. It's filled me with so much joy over the last year as I've seen them grow in skill, in passion, and in focus to connect people to Christ. It's an honor to worship with you every week, and I'm looking forward to another incredible year of connecting people to Christ!

Worship, Trinity Kids, Connection Groups, Trinity Students, Fellowship, Trinity Café, Little Lights, Basketball, Social Events, and all things Trinity Church have brought us together in one place thanks to the Spirit-led generosity of our congregation. In 2021, we completed the Bold Faith capital appeal that allowed for the "Bold" step to move forward on the new building project. At the same time, the Go! Campaign commenced to strategically equip our new facility for future mission. As expected with any new project (not to mention the continued challenges that the Covid-19 pandemic has placed on all of us), some expenses associated with acclimating to the new building exceeded budgeted projections. In addition to the added "moving expense". our General Fund revenue lagged for a few months during 2021 as many of us navigated changes to our "normal" life routines and rhythms as was discussed at the 2022 Budget Meeting in November. I am pleased to report that contributions in November and December have significantly improved General Fund balances for 2021, thus finishing the year at originally budgeted levels. A brief snapshot of the year-end finances is shown below. Thank you for your generosity and call to Christ's mission at Trinity Church!
