

From the Pastor's Desk....

God shows up in unexpected ways. He enters the world born as a human infant to young, unmarried kids. He arrives in a borrowed stable and is placed in an animal's feed trough. God shows up at the temple when He is twelve in the person of Jesus and astounds those present with his wisdom and understanding. He shows up to the poor, the weak, the broken with help, hope and healing. He shows up and His throne is a cross and His crown is made of thorns. Jesus shows up with love when He forgives those who crucified Him and promises resurrection to all who believe in Him. God shows up in unexpected ways.

The ways of God are so unexpected we do not always recognize His work. The issue is our attitude, our perspective, our spirit. Do we expect Him? Are we looking, expecting, accepting where God shows up?

Recently, I had a conversation with a man where we talked about "Nebraska nice". The changes in our society and the stresses of life in the last years has made "Nebraska nice" little more than a thin veneer. How often have we all experienced those moments when the veneer is worn through? There's frustration with life, anger at the changes in our world, and questions about our own preferences which block us for seeing God who shows up in unexpected ways.

This week a member of our church shared a piece of their morning devotions with me, Here is what they shared.

When it's time to join together in worship, are you caught up in the presentation of the music - whether it's a hymnal or worship choruses on the screen, whether it's organ music or guitar, your favorite songs or someone else's - or are you caught up in the beauty and holiness of Jesus?

And when you leave church on Sunday, did you realize that worship never ended, only the corporate aspect of it did? Do you realize that your whole life is a worship service unto the Lord, lived out every day as you prove your love for God by making Him the highest priority in your words, attitudes, thoughts, actions, and time?
