<u>Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes</u> January 28, 2024

65 people in attendance.

Marcus Schmidt called the meeting to order and opened in prayer.

The Annual Meeting Agenda can be found in the Annual Report.

With no comments or questions, Marcus entertained a motion to approve the agenda. Motion made and seconded. Approved.

Three congregational meetings were held in 2023. Marcus entertained a motion to approve those meeting minutes as presented in the Annual Report. Motion made and seconded. Approved.

All Ministry Reports are included in the Annual Report. With no questions or comments, Marcus entertained a motion to approve the Ministry Reports. Motion made and seconded. Approved.

Marcus called for the results of the voting. Carrie Nash presented the voting results as follows:

Marcus thanked all the nominees for volunteering to run.

Marcus opened the floor for any new business. No new business.

Marcus closed with lots of gratitude to Jesus, the leadership and staff at Trinity, and the entire congregation.

Pastor Erik closed the meeting in prayer.

In a short introduction to Council meeting following the Congregational Meeting, the following officers were elected for 2024:

Trinity Church Special Congregational Meeting Minutes January 7th, 2024

123 people in attendance.

Blank paper and pencils were distributed to voting members. Marcus Schmidt called the meeting to order and invited Brittany Fahrenkrog, Chair of the Call Committee to the stage. Brittany introduced the Call Committee, including Karen Van Briesen, Chad Troester, Beth Madson, Steve Arquitte, and John Popelka.

The Call Committee took the last several months to talk with the congregation to determine qualities Trinity wants to see in an associate pastor. The team agreed that we are looking for someone with a deep faith, a heart for ministry, an educator, a listener and someone with a focus on missions. After interviews, the team feels Matt Pearson is a great fit for all these qualities and are pleased to present Matt Pearson for the role of Associate Pastor.

Questions and discussion:

How does Matt's completion of seminary and ordination process fit in all of this? Pastor Erik explained that the process of call that we extend to Matt triggers the ordination process.

The ordination and installation of Matt will occur at the same service.

Matt has completed everything he needs to become our associate pastor.

Erik also added his support and endorsement of Matt as associate pastor.

With no other questions or comments, Brittany moved that Matt Pearson be called to serve as Associate Pastor at Trinity Church. Motion seconded.

While votes were counted, Marcus prayed over the process and for the provision given to Trinity.

115 votes were tallied and there was a unanimous vote of YES.

A voice vote is required to approve the compensation package for the new associate pastor. All details of the package were accounted for in the annual budget for 2024. Moved. Second. Unanimously approved.

A formal letter of call will be sent to the Synod Office.

Marcus closed the meeting.

<u>Annual Congregational Budget Meeting Minutes</u> November 17, 2024

70 people in attendance.

Victoria called the meeting to order at 11:46 AM and opened the meeting with prayer.

Mark reviewed the process completed to prepare the budget. Don Davern and staff prepare the preliminary budget numbers and meet with the finance committee. The Church Council reviews and approves the budget prior to bringing the budget to the Congregation.

Don Davern reviewed the handouts: Profit and Loss Budget Overview and Profit and Loss Budget Performance Building fund.

- Sources of income
- Ministry and Salary/Benefit expenses

63% of the expense budget is salary/Benefits. Benefits are generous, salaries are competitive with the market. We have a high-capacity staff who are extremely efficient.

Core Staff: 6 full-time, 3 part-time = 53% of the total.

Ancillary Staff (Little lights and cafe) and taxes comprise the other 10% of salary expenses.

Insurance costs have gone up 23%; increase in premiums as well as deductibles.

When we sold the lot to the Sarpy County Museum we saved \$250,000 as a safety net and intend to continue to keep this money in an account to continue to gain interest in the event it is needed in the future.

Questions: Benevolence: money for mission.

Trinity Students and Trinity Kids increases over 2024 budget: there was staff accounting misinterpretation of how budget was prepared for the budgets that were submitted last year. A large portion of these budgets are for camps and events.

Salary: we have budgeted for a new lead pastor, reduced Connections Minister hours, reduced Cafe Manager hours, and new part-time Missions Coordinator position. We have also budgeted for a 5% salary increase.

Suggestion for future budget handouts to include some sub-categories that explain what goes into each Ministry. Discussed that those reports are available if anyone has specific questions about each ministry.

Familia de Dios status: We have not received payment in 18 months, and they have been avoiding us. We continue to follow up, but we are not confident that we will receive any funds. They appear to be struggling financially.

We are happy to report that the projected income and expenses for 2025 are balanced at \$1,204,550.00.

Motion to approve the General Fund Budget for 2025 as submitted, second, and unanimously approved.

Building Fund Discussion: Interest rate of 3.95%. Balloon payment of \$3.8M will be due 09-30-2024

As long as we make our payments in the next few years, we should be able to re-negotiate the terms of the loan for an extension.

Victoria closed the meeting at 12:23 PM.

Mission's Report

Trinity makes a difference because of Jesus meeting tangible needs and sharing Christ with the world. In 2024, we continued to lean into our primary Missions with a local focus on Little Miracles by helping families with kids under two year old to have the things they needed to thrive. See report below for the good news.

Trinity also has two global mission partners. Our strong partnership continued with The Raining Season (TRS) in Sierra Leone West Africa. In 2024 they were in process of developing land for a larger center that will help lessen costs, as well as give the children in their care more opoportunity to thrive. Our other overseas partnership is with Pastor Pimpinan in North Sumatra, Indonesia. His church plant has seen incredible growth reaching new groups of people that had not been connected to Christ.

As a church on mission, Trinity also had various opportunities to connect people to Christ. Through the Stephen Center (12 meals), Thanksgiving baskets (117 meals), Operation Christmas Child with our Trinity Kids Ministry (103 boxes), the Giving Tree (MomCo support) and Angel Tree (Little Miracles). We have also been able to bless Trinity families in need through Trinity's Relief Fund. What a blessing it is to express God's love with the world and our community.

Trinity Kids 2024



This year we saw a huge amount of growth in our kids ministry. I am especially thankful for the generosity of so many (85) volunteers who have served this group consistently, joyfully and faithfully.

The paragraphs below show a snapshot of what God has done in Trinity Kids in 2024:

- "We Are Your Village" This year's campaign provided families with at-home opportunities to enforce
 our GO value with their kids. One of the most successful parts of this campaign is Legacy & TK Penpals
 which connected young families with a Trinity member 65+ years of age. Many of these relationships
 continue to close the gap between generations. The second was Operation Christmas Child in which we
 gave away 100 boxes to children in need across the world. We look forward to launching our 2025
 campaign: Present in Prayer.
- <u>Community Engagement and Missions</u> This year we made an effort to meet our community where
 they are at. One of those efforts was our Summer Play Dates. Families who saw Trinity as their church
 home were encouraged to meet within Papillion and Bellevue to get to know our community. Trinity
 Kids also continues to adopt a local mission initiative every 3 months. This year our kids have learned
 about and supported Angels Among Us, Little Miracles, Samaritans Purse, Project Harmony, Open Door
 Mission, as well as Trinity Village members, our local school partnerships, Little Lights' families and our
 local firefighters. Furthermore, we continued to connect with and sponsor Mary Kamara through TRS.
- <u>Developments In Our Weekly Program</u> In 2024, we welcomed over 40 new families and 17 new volunteers. We opened a new 4th-5th grade room second hour to accommodate this growth. A big focus was to engage kids more thoroughly in worship as this has been a struggle particularly for our younger children. We increased instruments, such as box drums and a keyboard, and our older kids joined the younger ones for a monthly elementary worship. Some of our TK graduates have been trained to serve in larger roles, such as facilitating whole groups or working 1:1 consistently with an adult volunteer to learn how to effectively teach their age group. I am so proud of our growing group of students who serve! Other additions include our new parent resources and a more thorough volunteer onboarding process.
- Events Always a highlight providing us with "new people momentum"!
 - Cafe & Play has become a consistently effective ministry as we meet and care for many of our young Papillion families each week. The new Kids Corner near the Cafe has been an oasis for those with small, busy bodies at Cafe & Play, as well as on Sundays and throughout the week.
 - Smaller events included JUMP (Jesus Use Me Please) for our 4-5th graders, Communion Classes, Kids Clothes Swaps, Summer Playdates as previously mentioned, our Busy Bee Workshop, Open House, Parent Meeting and our Christmas Family Party. We saw good engagement across the board.
 - **VBS** was FREE for the first time this year. This made a difference for many families and 250 kids attended!! We were overwhelmed with the support, including contributions to our collection of many pounds of animal feed, pet toys and a monetary donation for Scattered Joy Acres.
 - Boo Bash was a whirlwind! We anticipated 250 people and ended up with between 1000-1500. What
 a great time it was to be with our greater Papillion community, especially with the addition of our
 gospel video presentation. Thank you to all those to contributed who make this a big success!

Women's Ministry continued to pursue and live out our purpose to connect women to Christ and to one another. Did you know that there are 518 women actively connected to our church? Vital to this are our Serve Teams. Some are year round groups while others tackle a specific event. Check out what they accomplished in 2024.

- The Celebrations Serve Team sent out 518 birthday cards, 217 anniversary cards and a variety of congratulations and sympathy cards.
- The IF Planning Team hosted 137+ women last February. Connections were made and lives changed. In 2025, IF is shifting to Gather 25 to connect with the global church via simulcast.
- The Party Planners brought three different fun opportunities to connect, eat and laugh with Trivia (38), Bingo (33) and Game Day (27). They have wonderful ideas ready for 2025.
- The Food Team brought snacks and created meals for our parties and events, including the desserts for the church and community-wide Celebrate! event. This group is expanding their purpose to include the making of frozen meals to create Care Bags in 2025.
- The Chili-Cookoff Fundraiser Team hosted this annual event along with the packing opportunity to put together backpacks for food-insecure kids in our local area. We raised \$2,098 and put together 60 backpacks that provided 10 days worth of meals for kids.
- The Retreat Team planned and executed an incredible two days for women at a lodge in Van Buren County, IA. They appropriately named this annual retreat, Women of Grace, and created a beautiful logo to go with it. 14 attendees were blessed.
- The Women's Pray Team did just that. We consistently prayed for this ministry, the women served by it, mailed praying-for-you post cards, and supported any church-wide prayer events,

Café Report

Trinity Café has been expanding its reach! We are connecting the community with different events and have welcomed in both believers in Christ and those who we are setting the foundation for. One example is a group of moms from the adjacent neighborhood who came to the church during our voting process. They discovered the café and the play area and now meet every Thursday morning with their kids for a play date and a coffee. They have had the opportunity to see other events that we have and are building relationships with others.

We have also increased our connections with the community by increasing contacts with others such as the Sarpy County Chamber of Commerce and through marketing with social media. Kiley Cruse and Abby Tointon have done an amazing job with our Instagram posts which have grown followers further reaching others in our community.

Another café success is the collection of tips for Little Miracles. All tips in 2024 went directly to this mission totaling \$917.72! We are proud and honored to support other missions as well as our own.

Some of the regular activities that involve the café as well as other ministries include:

- Café and Play A group for children aged birth to five and their mothers, grandparents, caregivers, etc. The adults have a fellowship time sharing experiences and supporting one another while the children play and interact in the gym or in the play area designed by the Kids Minister Amanda Lynn.
- Story Time A group for toddlers, preschoolers, and their caregivers to interact with guided story time and crafts. Caregivers often get a coffee and the café has added drinks that are child-sized and geared towards their likes.
- Legacy Mornings A gathering of our 55+ members for devotion and discussion, guest speakers, community service projects, and just plain fun and games. In 2024, the gatherings were one Thursday a month. Word of the fun and interesting topics reached other 55+ members who were not able to attend on Thursdays, and a request was made to add an additional day of the week! So some months in 2025 will have 2 gatherings. This is a growing group of people supporting and loving one another as we all walk our journey of life.

Trinity Café has an amazing team of 18 volunteers aged 16 to 57! What a great variety of talent and stage of life to be able to interact with each other and provide service with such devotion and care for all our church members and visitors.

The café crew is excited to continue with its growth and reach into 2025!

Treasurer's Report

As your Trinity treasurer, I am pleased to present the annual financial report for 2024, providing an overview of how our collective contributions have been utilized to support our ministries and further our mission. I would be remiss if I didn't say thank you on behalf of Trinity council and staff for your generosity no matter the amount of your contributions – they are all very much appreciated.

2024 General Fund

In 2024, Trinity's annual income budget totaled \$1,151,225. Our actual congregational income for 2024 came in higher than our budget at \$1,196,209 which is \$44,984 over budget.

Expenses came in under budget and the council and staff did a great job managing expenses throughout the year. Total expenses in 2024 totaled \$1,102,046 against a budget of \$1,178,872 (under budget by \$76,826).

Here are a couple highlights of expenses in 2024:

- Benevolence of \$53,694 will be given to the various supported Trinity missions.
- Trinity staff personnel expenses totaled \$699,612 against a budget of \$795,575 under budget primarily due to the retirement of our senior pastor Erik Boye.

The congregation general fund giving for 2024 was over budget and very positive, resulting in a net contribution gain of \$94,163 versus a budgeted loss of \$27,647, bringing the general fund cash reserves to \$282,775 to begin 2025. This is first time in recent years that we have had an annual net contribution gain!!! Our congregational approved budget for 2025 is flat to 2024 with some restraint on technology, church utilities, administrative items, and staff salaries/benefits.

Capital Campaigns in 2024

We continued to receive gifts related to the "Go Vision" three-year campaign that started in 2021 and received \$203,437 in 2024 putting us within a whisker of our goal of \$1.2M (3 year total = \$1,163,983). We launched and implemented the "Here For Good" initiative last fall and have received gifts at the end of 2024 totaling \$77,852. We're off to a great start on our three year capital campaign goal of \$1.5M (stretch target of \$2M) with 140 congregation household pledges totaling \$1,135,528 YTD and more coming in as I write this report – Very Exciting! Every contribution helps us reduce our debt, freeing up more funds for vital ministries.

Again, thank you to the entire congregation for your faithful giving in 2024 and to our staff and council members for their responsible management of God's Gifts to Trinity.
